

## Grant 2020-2021 FUNDING GUIDELINES

<b>History and Purpose</b>	Project Management Institute Sacramento Valley Chapter (PMI-SVC) has determined that community needs are to be supported financially and designates a proportion of the annual budget to grants
<b>Alignment with Mission and Vision</b>	<p>Grant funds are awarded in alignment with PMI-SVC chapter's mission and vision.</p> <p>MISSION: Promote project management as a profession to the community</p> <p>VISION: To be recognized by practitioners and employers in our community as the essential and preferred choice for support and excellence of project management best practices.</p>
<b>Funds Available</b>	The total Grant funds available annually is determined during our annual budget process
<b>Maximum Awards</b>	The maximum awards will be determined based on the number of qualified applicants
<b>Eligibility</b>	<p>Non-profit 501(c)(3) or 501(c)(4) organizations serving the PMI-SVC community are eligible to apply.</p> <p>Applicants who failed to submit a Final Report from the prior year are not eligible to apply during the current funding cycle.</p>
<b>Public Documents</b>	All grants submitted to PMI-SVC are available to the public for review upon request
<b>Funding, Limitations and Reporting</b>	<p>The Grants Committee will approve grants at the PMI-SVC Board Meeting according to the published schedule. Awards are made for one year only and in no way imply that funding will be awarded in subsequent years.</p> <p>Grant funds must be used for the purpose specified in the grant application. All funds must be spent by December or returned to PMI-SVC. Final Reports are due on December 31<sup>st</sup> and should include details regarding project expenditures and results.</p>
